T16 Grandstand Ticket

The T16 Grandstand at the Lusail International Circuit, as its name suggests, is located overlooking turn 16.

As a brand new seating area, this will be an exciting venue for fans with great views of the F1 cars as they race at high speed in the final section of the circuit.

Ticket holders will have a direct view of all the action in Turn 16, where fans will have a view of the cars breaking from high speed in the final corner before they enter the main straight.

In addition to the on-track activity, ticket holders will have access to all the post-race F1 concerts featuring some of the top international artists.

The ticket includes:

Admission for all three days of the event.

Access to 3 days of free seating on the T16 stand.

Entrance to the F1® Fan Village where you will find entertainment, activities for adults and children, and live entertainment.

Immerse yourself in Pearl, Qatar Discover a fascinating island in Doha where luxury, leisure and a thriving community coexist. Pearl Qatar is a man-made island near Doha's famous West Bay District. Featuring Mediterranean-style yacht marinas, residential towers, villas and hotels, the area also offers a luxury shopping experience with boutiques and premium designer showrooms. The island is also home to trendy restaurants – from refreshing ice creams to five-star dining experiences, and stands out for its pedestrian-friendly squares and plazas along with a wide variety of beautifully landscaped gardens. The Pearl is a popular visitor attraction due to its elegance, with descriptions such as the 'Arabian Riviera'.

Souq Waqif

Built on the site of Doha's old commercial market on the banks of Wadi Musheireb, Souq Waqif looks anachronistic, especially against the backdrop of Doha's dramatic modernist skyline. With its mud-caked buildings, the market harkens back to a bygone era, while

remaining a hub of activity where commerce and gossip collide. The winding streets of Souq Waqif offer a tableau of traditional street life. Here, the 12 reasons why Souq Waqif is something to do:

Hold a hawk in your hand

Falconry is a traditional sport in Qatar and Souq Waqif hosts a Falcon Souq where you can see the majestic birds up close and, under the watchful eye of the shopkeeper, pose with a falcon perched in your hand. It's also possible to buy hawks and accessories here, and an exclusive hospital treats whatever ails them. See some camels and horses Head to the camel corral near Falcon Souq to see these creatures through doe-eyed eyes, or wander through the Emiri stables, where gorgeous Arabian horses dominate amidst taking the heritage police on their daily rounds of the souk. Indulge in some retail therapy The shops lining the alleys of the souk beckon with all manner of wares, both practical and fantastic. From shoes to antiques to crafts, the souk rewards treasure hunters with items from all over the region. Fishing and pearl diving equipment compete for attention with woven textiles, rugs, wooden furniture and glass ornaments made in adjacent workshops. Aspiring musicians can enjoy local varieties of drums, flutes and stringed instruments, including the melodic oud. Get some art Decorated with beautiful wood carvings, hand-painted tiles and colourful lanterns, the Souq Waqif Art Centre showcases the works of local and visiting artists, all available for sale. Around the showroom are workshops and you can take an art class or watch artists at work. Add spice to your life Follow your nose to the spices pouring out of jute bags. From whole or ground spices, this is your place for exotic Arabic flavors like saffron, sugar, sumac, dried flowers, dried black lemons and endless varieties of dates, honey, tea leaves and coffee beans. Learn about pearls Qatar has been at the heart of the pearl industry in days gone by. At the pearl shop located among the shops selling handicrafts, you can chat with the owner – a former pearl diver, learn about the lost art of pearl making and see the many varieties of white, pink and grey pearls.

Buy some local beauty products

At Souq, you can find many of the region's traditional perfumes and cosmetics, from oud and musk to specially made stencil perfumes, koj, argan oil and henna. For a temporary souvenir, get a fresh henna tattoo by an artist on site. Eat like a champ From restaurants to hawkers, the souk has food to reduce hunger. Local women gather in the main courtyard selling everything from samosas and stuffed grape leaves to meat stews and sweet pasta. If street food isn't your thing, try karak tea and crepes (regag) at Shay al Shamoos, makhboos (a traditional rice dish) at Al Jasra, fahsa (confident cooked meat in clay pots) eaten in traditional style sitting on the floor at Bander Aden. , and the mouth-watering cauliflower and baklava at Al Aker Sweets.

Relax like a local

Souq Waqif is by far the most popular place to hang out with friends, especially after dusk. Open until the early hours of the morning, the roadside cafes offer an endless supply of Arabic coffee, fresh fruit juices and hookah with your choice of aromatic tobacco. Many restaurants have TV screens showing football matches, while some, such as Majlis Al Dana, offer backgammon, a popular local board game.

Feel like Persian kings

Once inside Paris, you'll find yourself in a dazzling palatial setting with intricate mirrors and antique glass lanterns. Many of the items in this restaurant were selected from Iran and assembled in Doha over many years.

Enjoy the street performances

The souk is busiest in the cooler months, with cultural performances by local or regional groups. There are often costume parades and street performances during the annual Shop Qatar or Eid festivals. The open courtyards of the souk also host frequent exhibitions.
